
Yellowstone Adventure Camp

The camp will operate in the greater Mammoth and Gardiner areas. Weekly drop off and pick up locations will be given to families one to two weeks ahead of time. We will also seek to help families get in touch to coordinate carpooling.

Core Hours: 8:30am-4:30pm

Extended Care Hours: 7:45am-5:15pm

Who can participate: Students entering 1st - 6th grades in the fall of 2017 who live within the Gardiner Public School District.

Weekly Cost*:

- Regular Tuition - \$110
- Helping Parents Rate Tuition - \$80

We will offer 5 slots for helping parents each week. Four positions will entail volunteering one 1/2 day per week enrolled (to be scheduled by Snoopy Cooperative Preschool) and one position will entail preparing supplies for the week.

The weekly themes are subject to change. Please note on your registration if your enrollment in a particular week is theme-dependent; if so, we will contact you and do our best to accommodate enrollment changes.

Snoopy Cooperative Preschool is happy to present Yellowstone Adventure Camp with Gardiner Public Schools through a Special Use Permit with the National Park Service. **Yellowstone Adventure Camp will operate instead of the Explore Yellowstone program that has operated in years past.**

The Special Use Permit stipulates that priority be given to families in the following order:

1. National Park Service Employees
2. Employees of park concessionaires and park partners.
3. All others

We will also give priority to families who need the full nine weeks of camp for their elementary-aged students.

June 12-15 Animal Detectives
